How to Call the Police Department

When calling the Police Department to report an incident or crime, please be prepared to answer the following questions as briefly and clearly as possible:

WHERE is it occurring?
WHEN is it occurring? Is it happening now or did it just occur?
WHO is involved?
Provide a description of the individuals involved. AND
Provide a description of the vehicle involved, including the direction it was going, if appropriate.
For example, you can say...
"This is not an emergency. I want to report suspicious activity. I don't want to give my name and address." (However, if you are willing to identify yourself, please do so.)
"The suspicious activity is ______."
"The location is ______."
"There are ____ (number) cars." (if cars are involved)

Please call as soon as you see or hear the suspicious activity. The dispatcher won't be able to tell you when the police will be there. Sometimes the police are on higher priority calls and can't get out right away, but they will respond as quickly as they can.

"The cars are ." (make, model, color like Blue Jeep Cherokee)

"The license plate numbers are ."

Please keep in mind that you may be asked "Do you have an emergency?" when your call is answered, or you may be placed on hold depending on the calls(s) the Dispatcher is working on at the time of your call. You may also be asked a number of additional questions depending on the nature of the incident you are reporting. Please let the Dispatcher ask the questions.
